


Houthis as Proxies for Iran?

- "These constant reports that the Houthis are working for the Iranians are nonsense" They've been fighting Al-Qaeda since at least 2012, and they've been winning. Why are we fighting a movement that's fighting Al-Qaeda?" Michael Horton, Yemen Expert
- "The United States has (...) dissented from Saudi claims that Iran is controlling the Houthis."
- "There is little evidence that the Iranians have provided significant military support to the Houthis or exercise significant control over the group" April Alley, a researcher with the International Crisis Group."

Saudi Airstrikes and Blockade

- Saudi-led coalition is committing many apparent violations of the laws of war
 - Indiscriminate attacks on civilians
 - Use of internationally banned cluster munitions

"The coalition-imposed blockade may amount to starvation of civilians as a method of warfare, a war crime".



Sixty years to the month after President Dwight D. Eisenhower prophetically warned against the "unwarranted influence" of the "military-industrial complex" in his farewell address, the chief executive of one of the world's biggest weapons makers affirmed that ongoing war in the Middle East is good for business.

"Look...peace is not going to break out in the Middle East anytime soon," Hayes said. "I think it remains an area where we'll continue to see solid growth."

Similarly, Lockheed Martin CEO Jim Taiclet expected foreign arms sales to remain a priority in the Biden administration.

"As far as international business, including foreign military sales, the tendency of the people in the Biden administration [and] in the president's own statements, reiterate his view that alliances are important that they need to be cultivated, and that they have real value in deterrence and national defense," Taiclet said. "I do think that we'll have a more open environment for [foreign military sales] and direct commercial sales to our international partners."

Taiclet said foreign weapon sales are a way to generate American jobs and stimulate the U.S. economy.

"If jobs and the economy are important, the promotion of international defense sales, one would surmise, would also be important," Taiclet said Tuesday morning on Lockheed's quarterly earnings call.



U.S. Response to Red Sea Crisis


- U.S. military coalition began patrolling the Red Sea (11/22)
- U.S. established Operation Prosperity Guardian (12/18)
- U.S/UK military attacked Yemen (Jan 12)
- U.S. designates the Houthis a terrorist group (Jan. 17)
- U.S. decision to designate the Houthis a terrorist group temporarily blocked a crucial element of the peace process.
 - Salaries to public servants who have not been paid since August of 2016 can't be made until US grants a license authorizing it.

US Designation of AA as SDGT

- "I think it's a form of do-something-ism," he told Al Jazeera. The reimposition of the SDGT designation, he added, is a reflection of Washington's refusal to recognize that recent Houthi attacks are linked to the war in Gaza.
- "The Biden administration has put itself in a box ... where it doesn't have good policy options."

Future of Peace Process in Yemen


- Anti-Houthi groups in Yemen began calling for international support to start fighting.
- U.S. Ambassador met with the Minister of Defense in the IRG
- "The escalation in the Red Sea has resulted in the direct suspension of a deal that was anticipated to be announced in recent months," Ahmed Nagi, a senior Yemen analyst at the International Crisis Group, a think tank.
- "The U.N.-led political discussions are presently at a standstill."






